Entity Structure

The trust is made up of a trust board that may include medical practitioners and lay people. The minimum number of trustees is three, and the maximum number is nine. The Trust engages a specialist nurse contractor to provide support for people and their family/whānau following a diagnosis of sepsis. Other medical contracts are fulfilled based on expertise, experience and contractor requirements.

Main Sources of Entity's Cash and Resources

The charity's main sources of funds are grants, donations and contracts with crown agencies that rely on our expertise and experience.

Main Methods Used by Entity to Raise Funds

The main sources of income for the charity in this financial year were crown agency contracts to provide consultancy and educational activities, together with grants and donations sourced by application.

The NZ Sepsis Trust board is managed by Volunteer Trustees and officers who give their time to set strategy and initiate any activities that the Trust chooses to participate in.

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Statement of Service Performance

Description of Entity's Outcomes

Introducing the Trust

The New Zealand Sepsis Trust provides advocacy or support for people with sepsis, independently of where they were admitted (i.e. ICU vs non-ICU), who they are (i.e. children vs adults) or which infection caused it (i.e. meningitis vs other infections).

Over time, we have built a reputation for consistency and professionalism, and have provided widely respected clinical advocacy and educational materials to a number of crown, health and public agencies.

Our **vision** is "No preventable deaths from sepsis in Aotearoa New Zealand' and our **mission** is "Increasing awareness, saving lives".

Our operations are centred on four core areas of activity, being:

Public Education with a goal to increase awareness and understanding of sepsis and the common infections that cause it. Alongside this, we aspire to create and deliver targeted and culturally appropriate education and campaigns to specific groups and populations.

Health Care Education, with a goal to have an upskilled health workforce ready to recognise/ react/respond to a sepsis crisis in their place of work.

Support for Sufferers and their Whānau, with a goal to provide support for patients with sepsis and their whānau.

Research, Advocacy and Leadership with a goal to fund research and quality improvement initiatives that are aligned with our education and support priorities.

Through our activities we aspire to provide thought leadership and deliver an exemplar performance on a global stage.

Strategic Relationships:

The New Zealand Sepsis Trust are the delivery champions for the National Sepsis Action Plan. In this capacity, we provide advocacy to crown agencies including Te Tahu Hauora/ Health Quality and Safety Commission, Accident Compensation Corporation and Hatu Hone St John. Our educational materials have been adopted by Southern Cross Hospitals, and special societies and advisors to Te Whatu Ora. Additionally, organisations like Hatu Hone St John, Wellington Free Ambulance and Peke Waihanga assist us with fundraising and awareness efforts.

At an International level we are affiliated to the Global Sepsis Alliance, a network of over 130 organisations working to reduce the global burden of sepsis. Our work is guided by the 2017 World Health Assembly (WHA) resolution 70.7, to which the New Zealand government is a signatory.

The key pillars of WHA 70.7 are:

- 1. To develop national guidance on sepsis prevention and management.
- 2. To define the clinical standards, infrastructure, laboratory capacity, and funding required to reduce morbidity, and mortality due to sepsis.
- 3. To document the public health impacts of sepsis, and to accurately estimate national and international burdens of sepsis.
- 4. To collaborate with stakeholder organizations and partners to enhance sepsis treatment and prevention, including infection prevention in healthcare, and programmes of vaccination.

Public Education

Trust volunteers in multiple public hospitals in New Zealand marked World Sepsis Day in their institutions, sharing awareness materials and participating in our key fundraising activity: "Step for Sepsis". Trust clinical experts contributed to development of a sepsis awareness module for primary care providers, now published by the Goodfellow Unit.

Health Care Education

Design, implementation, and evaluation of hospital-based quality improvment programme: Raise the Flag (Christchurch 2023, following roll out in Taranaki and Waikato in previous years).

Support for Sufferers and Their Whānau

The Trust continues to employ a specialist nurse who is available to provide support to sepsis survivors and their whānau. Feedback from individual survivors suggests that this support is invaluable for those who seek it out.

Core activities included:

- Facebook support group.
- In-person support meetings.
- Collaboration on resources for primary care.
- Patient awareness resources online.
- Networking with international organisations including Global Sepsis Alliance, UK Sepsis Trustand the Australian Sepsis Network.

Research, Advocacy, Leadership

Contracted to provide clinical leadership for the National Sepsis Quality Improvement Project with HQSC: 2024

The Sepsis Trust NZ has provided:

- Clinical advisors in medicine and nursing.
- Public awareness and design material.
- Raise the Flag evaluations at Waikato Hospital which determined that the programme reduced hospital mortality by 17%.
- Preliminary work on a Predictive Sepsis Dashboard for Public Hospitals.

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Additional Information

Every week in New Zealand, over 200 people will develop sepsis.

A quarter of all hospital admissions in New Zealand are associated with an infection that needs antibiotic treatment – 1 in 10 will develop sepsis. This also means that people with sepsis are at the most risk from a rising tide of antibiotic resistance.

In 2016, sepsis admissions cost an average of \$13,500 per admission. 20% of cases lead to an intensive care unit admission.

The good news for our Trust and its supporters is that improving sepsis care is highly cost-effective. In Victoria, Australia, it has been estimated that a \$1.8M investment in sepsis care saved 52 lives and \$371M in direct and in-direct costs to society. (Brusco et al 2023).

'How did we do our accounting?'

Basis of Preparation

The entity is permitted by law to apply the Tier 3 (NFP) Standard issued by the External Reporting Board (XRB) and has elected to do so. All transactions in the Performance Report are reported using the accrual basis of accounting.

Goods and Services Tax (GST)

The entity is registered for GST. All amounts are stated exclusive of goods and services tax (GST) except for accounts payable and accounts receivable which are stated inclusive of GST.

Income Tax

The New Zealand Sepsis Trust is wholly exempt from New Zealand income tax having fully complied with all statutory conditions for these exemptions.

Bank Accounts and Cash

Bank accounts and cash in the Statement of Receipts and Payments comprise cash balances and bank balances (including short term deposits) with original maturities of 90 days or less.
